Part 2.

Pope Francis points out that "humanity has changed profoundly, and the accumulation of constant novelties results in a superficiality which pulls us in one direction. It is difficult to pause and recover depth of life."

Because of our lifestyles, throw away culture, pollution and waste we are doing untold damage to our environment and society. One third of all food produced is discarded, and "whenever food is thrown out it is as if it were stolen from the tables of the poor."

Each year sees the disappearance of thousands of plant and animal species which we will never know, which our children will never see - lost for ever. Already climate change with rising temperatures and drought, it is affecting the poor and their farming, and forces them to leave their homes, leading to migration and further misery.

Pope Francis stresses that the world is "One single human family. There are no frontiers or barriers, political or social, behind which we can hide; still less is there room for the globalisation of indifference." There must be a relationship of mutual responsibility between human beings and nature.

Pope Francis warns that not only has God given the Earth to man, who must use it with respect for the original good purpose it was given, but man too is God's gift to man. He must therefore respect the natural and moral structure with which he has been endowed. "When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the worth of a poor person, a 'human embryo', a person with disabilities - to offer a few examples - it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself, everything is connected."
